## Music Lessons – Expressions of Interest

We intend to continue the music program at school next year, and will also be able to offer guitar lessons with a qualified teacher. We have half-sized guitars which we can lend to students. Both keyboard and guitar lessons will be \$20 for an individual lesson (approximately 20 minutes). Ms Hamer will be teaching recorder.

For students in Years 2 to 6 only, could any parents who are interested in music lessons for their child/ren please indicate on the return slip at the bottom of the newsletter which instrument they would like to learn. NOTE: Students need to choose between guitar and keyboard. They cannot do both at school. Also, some recorder lessons will need to be held before school or at lunch-time. Students need to be prepared to make that commitment if they wish to do recorder. Drumming will also be available again next year and this can be done in conjunction with either key board or guitar if desired. Drumming is available to student from K to Y6.

## **Musical Instruments on Loan**

All students who borrowed instruments from the school will need to return them on the Tuesday of the musical performance. This includes recorders and keyboards on loan. Recorder students are also asked to return their recorder folders - these will be re-issued next year if the student continues with recorder lessons.
